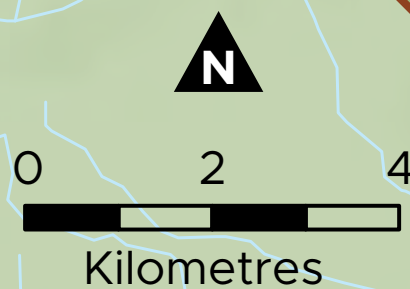
Battling wetland weeds
